### Pen Portrait- Jonathan Watson

Jonathon is our newest parent governor who originally hails from the Midlands but has lived in the village with his wife since 2017. Prior to joining the governing board, he served as a Parish Councillor for over 3 years but was always determined to play an active school role once his son joined Bishop. Jonathan's professional background as a business intelligence manager brings a wealth of skills and experience that is proving to be a valuable asset to the Board of Governors and consequently to the school and its children.



### Governor Activity

Each of the two committees (Resources and Teaching & Learning) have been beavering away behind the scenes to ensure that governance at Bishop is informed, focussed on the things that matter and remains strategic. We look at the progress the school is making against the criteria set in the school development plan and discuss ways in which we can support the school to be even better than it already is! We want our school to be 'the best it can be'. To this effect, at the end of every meeting, we collectively ask, 'What have we done to improve the education of the children at our school?'

Many of the governing board also come into school on a regular basis to meet members of the teaching team and support staff to further their knowledge of the curriculum, find out about new initiatives, consider safeguarding, health and safety and to see how resources are being used effectively. Graham Hooker attended the staff non-pupil day in January to gain some insight into how writing is being assessed against age related expected criteria. He was impressed by the professional dialogue between staff which enabled them to agree or moderate their judgements to ensure accuracy and consistency across the school. This term Graham Hooker and Sonya Lamoon were invited into school to meet the School Council who had prepared some excellent questions for them. The questions and subsequent answers have now been published on the Governance page on the school website. Who knew that Graham's favourite animals were slugs and worms?!



### Social Media

As the school continues to explore ways to share their work across the community and give greater insights into the many different aspects of school- life, we have seen an increase in the frequency of social media posts which celebrate all the great things that are happening. These posts also keep you informed and up

to date with special events and aspects of school life that happen beyond the classroom. If you can like, comment or share these posts we can continue to raise our profile in the wider community which in turn may help to improve pupil numbers in some year groups.
